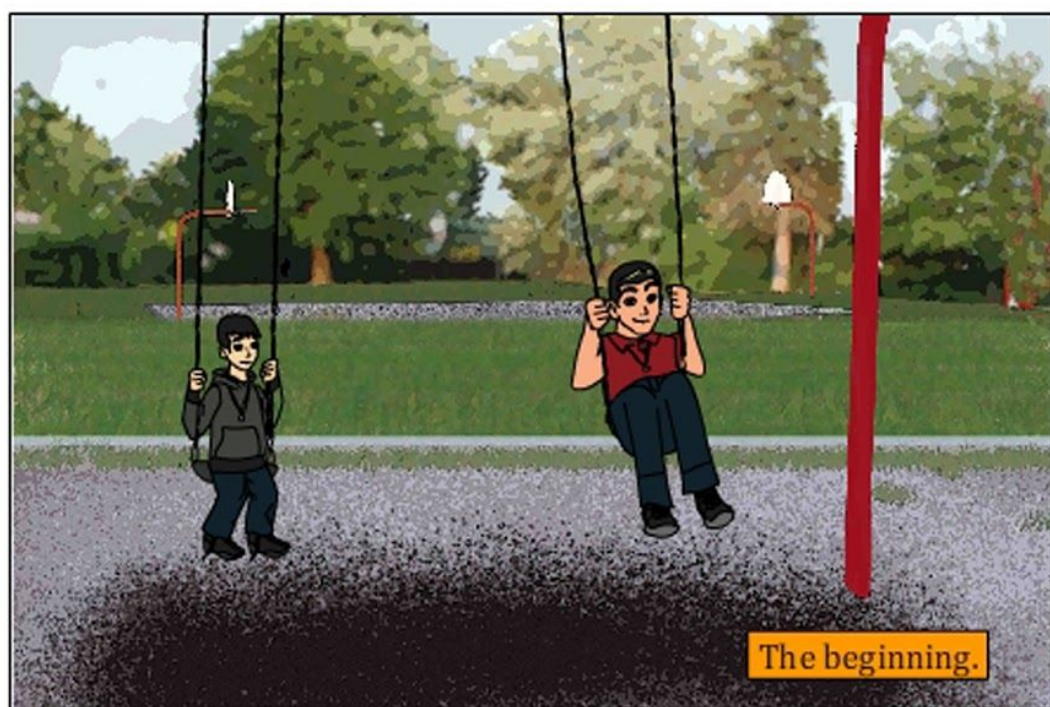

Where am I? Oh...

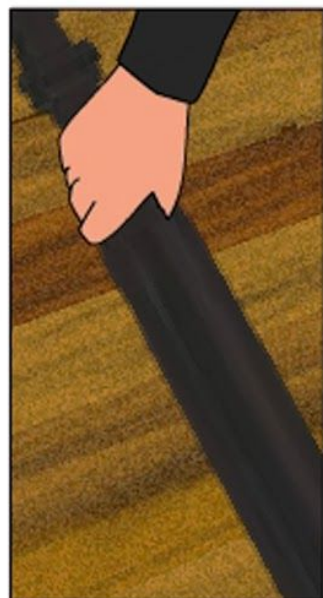
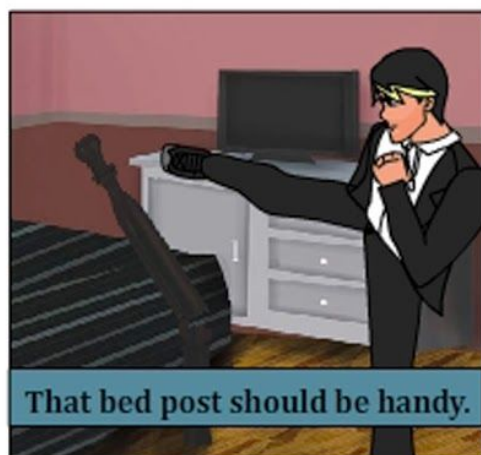


Well I can't use the normal way out.



The window is also out of the question. I don't want to feed oxygen to the flames.







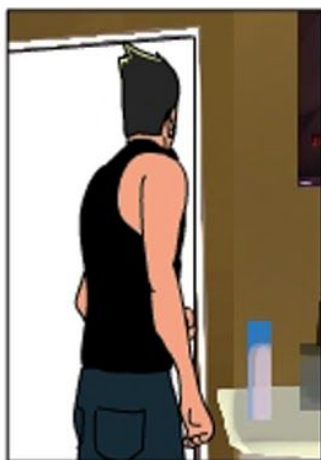

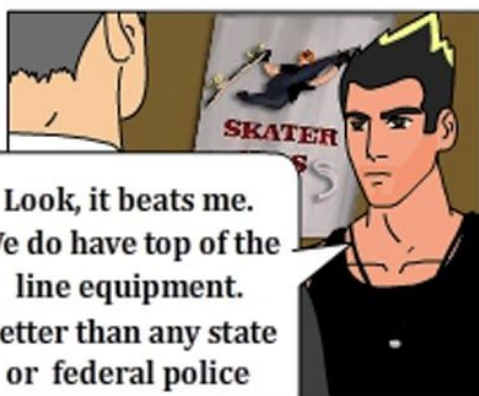




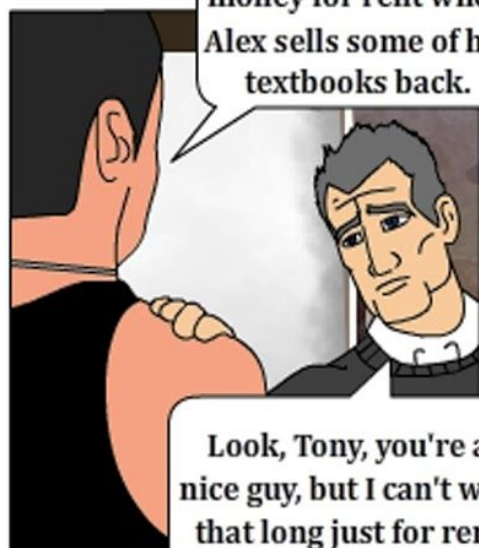




Well, if A.C.E isn't paying you guys that well then why exactly are our taxes going up? I thought a private police force was supposed to be "less expensive" for the state.



Look, it beats me. We do have top of the line equipment. Better than any state or federal police force.

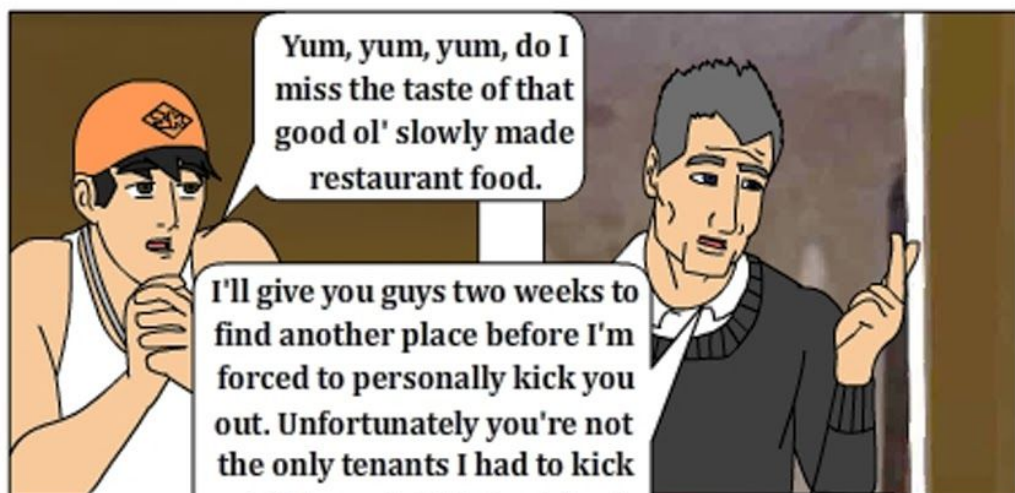


I should be able to scrounge up some money for rent when Alex sells some of his textbooks back.

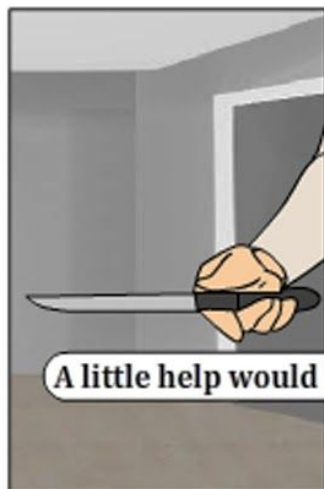
Look, Tony, you're a nice guy, but I can't wait that long just for rent money. I'm going to have to kick you guys out.

Providing you're the only students that ever stay after, I figure I'll actually reward you with something interesting today.

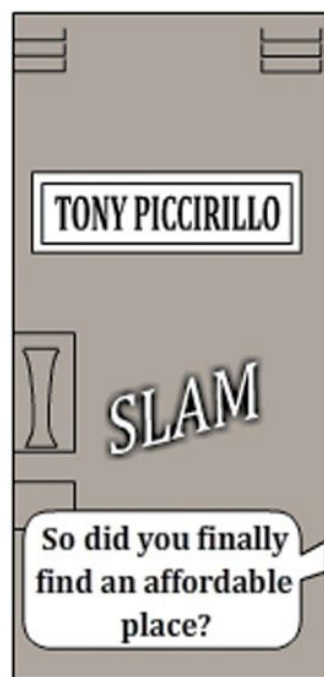

Cybernetics. Not just average cybernetics either. I mean the real deal. What I'm working on is likely to be the biggest scientific and technological breakthrough yet.





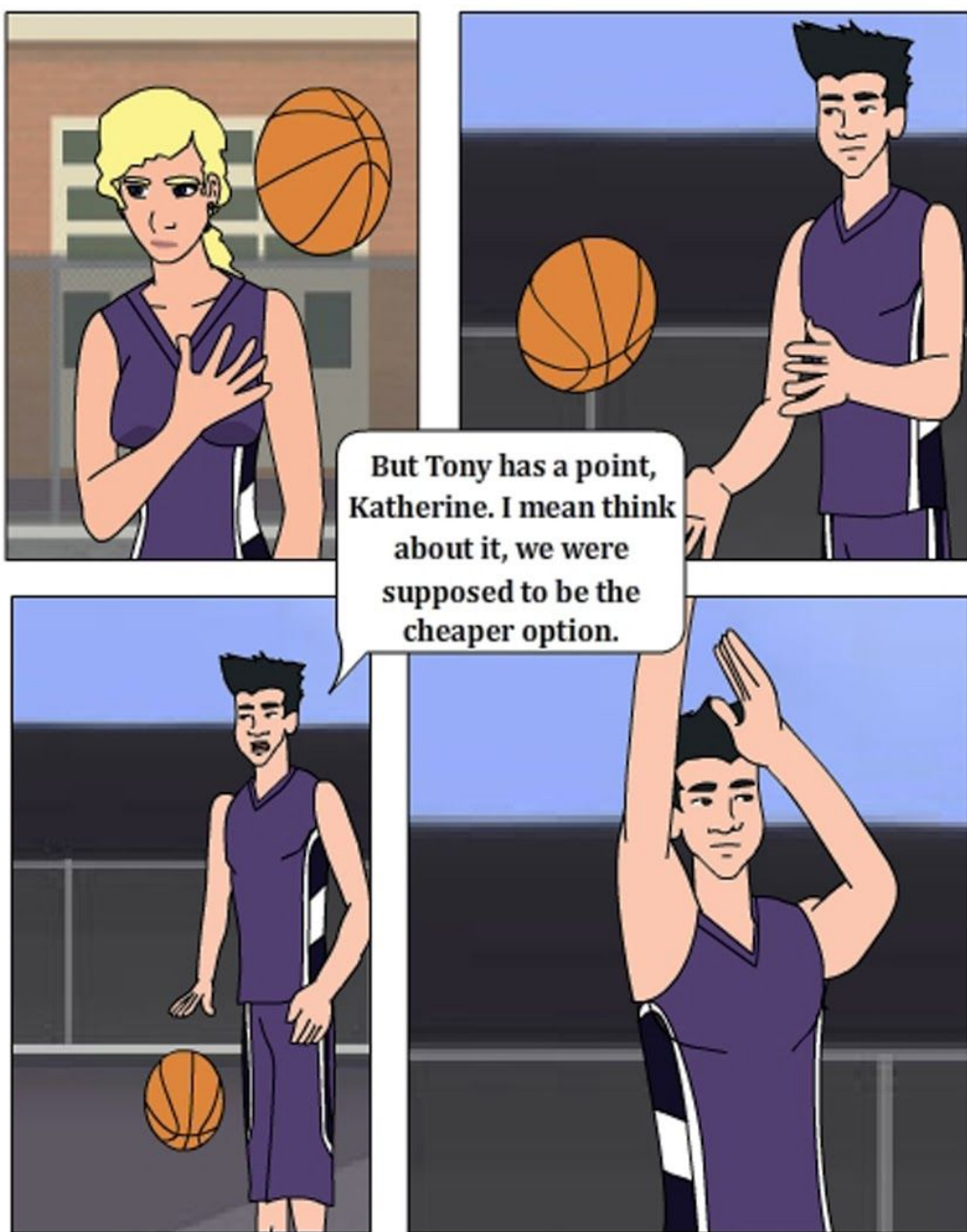

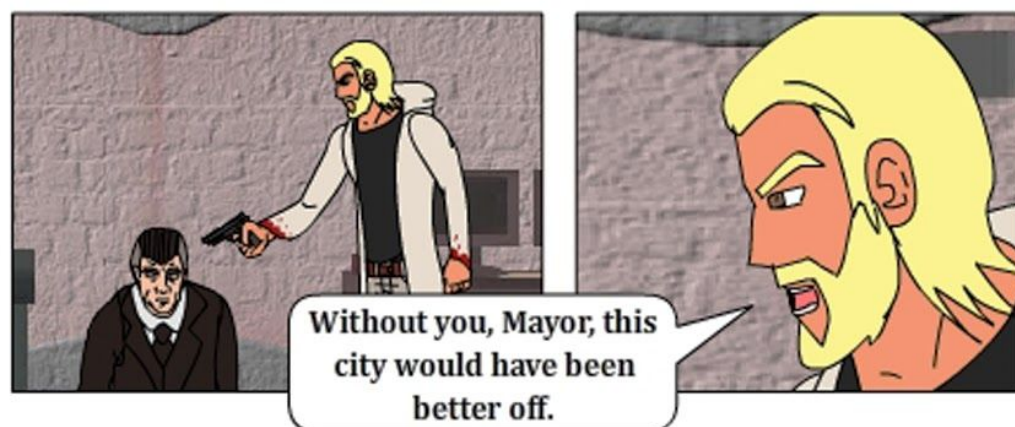
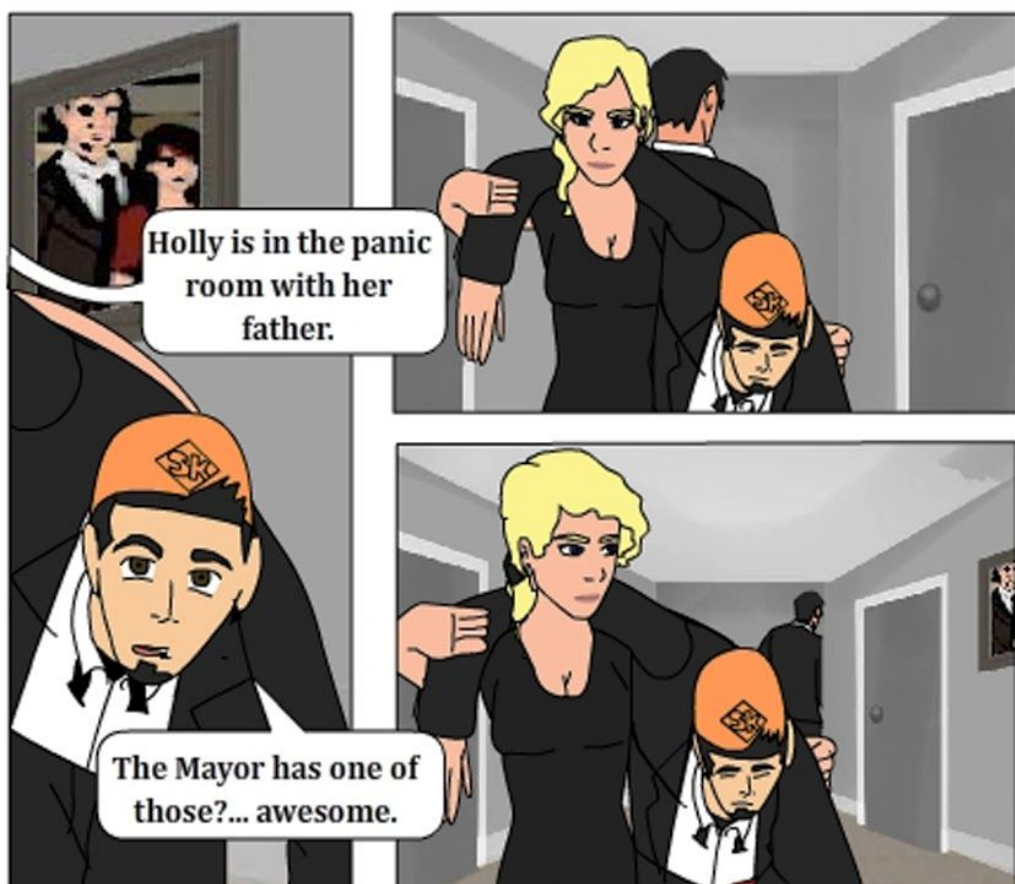


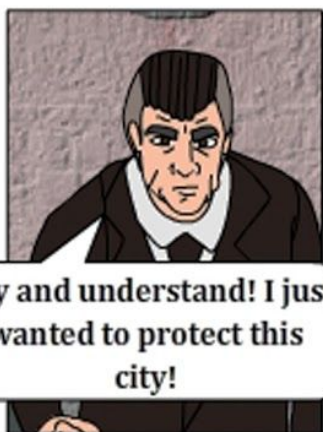








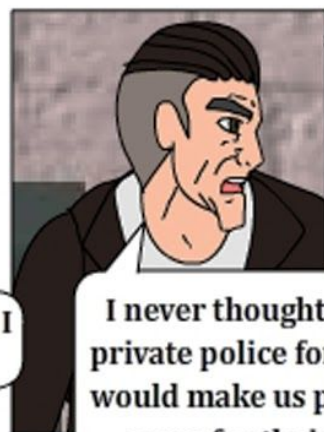




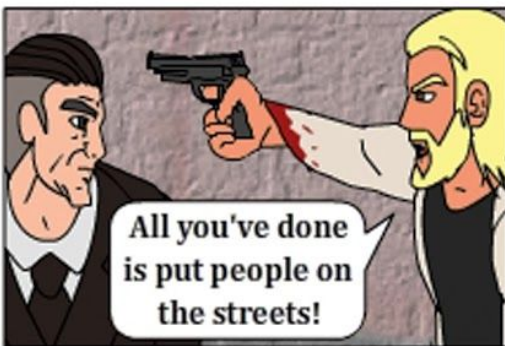
Try and understand! I just wanted to protect this city!
